• Luther and the Diet of Worms

"Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the pope or in councils alone, since it is well known that they often err and contradict themselves), I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not retract anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. I cannot do otherwise, here I stand, may God help me, Amen." – Martin Luther



3. "What Scripture says, God says"

2 Timothy 3:16-17

Acts 13:34 And as for the fact that he raised him from the dead, no more to return to corruption, [God] has spoken in this way,

"I will give you the holy and sure blessings of David.' [Isaiah 55:3]
